

Seminar: Women, Security and Economic Development in Rural Afghanistan

Meet Palwasha Kakar, the Afghan Deputy Minister of Women's Affairs along with an inspiring panel of guest speakers representing a cross section of perspectives from government to research institutions and from civil society organizations to NATO.

The seminar is a unique opportunity to discuss the importance of women's full involvement in efforts to promote development and security by addressing the interconnectedness of Afghan women's human rights, security situation and empowerment process in the transition phase.

Women are among the most vulnerable in Afghan society. Afghan women suffer discrimination and exclusion in economic, political and social terms, and many see their human rights compromised on a daily basis. Nevertheless, unleashing Afghan women's full potential is paramount for sustainable economic and social development in the country now and beyond 2014. The speakers on Panel 1 will share lessons learnt and discuss future challenges on organizing and empowering women in Afghan rural communities and how to link them to decision making processes at local and national levels.

A stable security environment and the implementation of human rights for women into civil society are essential to ensure the empowerment process. The UNSC Resolution 1325 reaffirms the important role of women in the prevention and resolution of conflicts. With point of departure in Resolution 1325 Panel 2 will revolve around best practice for ensuring women's rights in order to promote security and economic development in rural Afghanistan.
